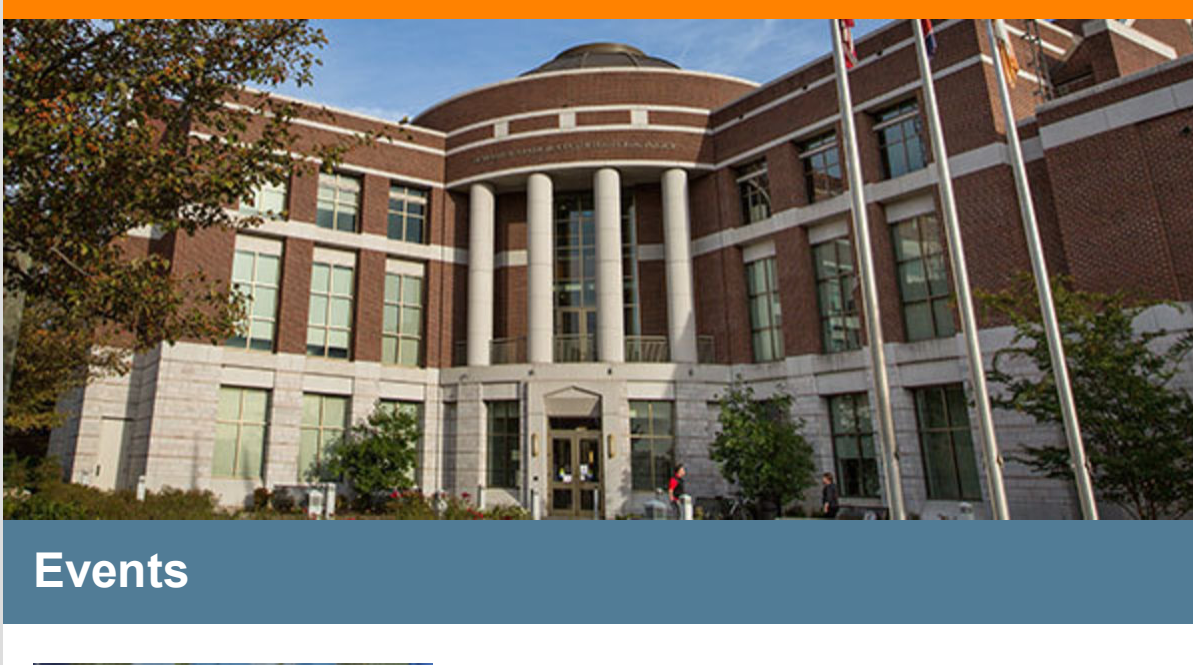
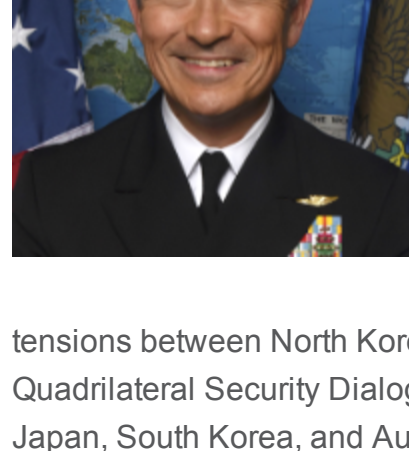

### Ashe Lecture: U.S. National Security in the Indo-Pacific

Please join us for an Ashe Lecture featuring former U.S. Ambassador to South Korea and former Commander of United States Indo-Pacific Command, [Admiral Harry B. Harris, Jr.](#) He will provide an overview of current issues affecting Asia and the Indo-Pacific region.

Harris will discuss the rise of China, ongoing tensions between North Korea and South Korea; U.S. partners in the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (Quad); the important role of U.S. alliances with Japan, South Korea, and Australia (including AUKUS); and what these issues and tensions mean for U.S. national security interests in the region.

Harris will also address the impact of the Russian war in Ukraine in Asia and how the war could impact the status of Taiwan and China's threats to invade.

The lecture will be held on **Tuesday, August 30, from 5:30 to 6:30 pm** in the Toyota Auditorium or through our [live webcast](#).

### Appalachian Leadership Institute Holds Graduation

On Thursday, July 28, the Appalachian Regional Commission's [Appalachian Leadership Institute](#) 2021-2022 Class of Fellows Class graduated after completing a nine-month all-inclusive leadership and economic development training program. [Dr. Katie Cahill](#), Director of the Center's [Leadership and Governance Program](#),

addressed the fellows on what is now expected of them, "You all came to us as leaders, but you are now charged with leadership of the Region. It is your job, your task, and your responsibility to help communities thrive and be successful."



### National Nuclear Security Administration

[Global Security](#) Director [Krista Wiegand](#) and Fellows [Wonjae Hwang](#), [Brandon Prins](#), [Jon Ring](#), and [Gary Uzonyi](#) met on July 20 with 16 representatives from the [Office of Congressional and Intergovernmental Affairs](#) of the [National Nuclear Security Administration \(NNSA\)](#) who visited the Baker Center as part of a trip to Tennessee. In the meeting, the Global Security

Fellows discussed with the NNSA representatives issues ranging from North Korea's threats, nuclear deterrence, the rise of China, disinformation campaigns by Russia, maritime security, and U.S. national security priorities. The NNSA group also visited [ORNL](#) and [Y-12 National Security Complex](#) as part of their trip to the area.



### REE Article on Climate Policy

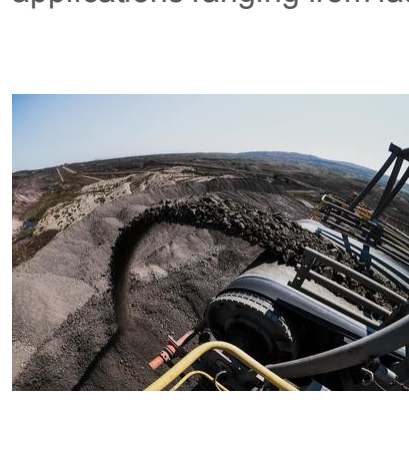
[Energy & Environment](#) Fellow [Dr. David McCollum](#) published an article in [Resource and Energy Economics \(REE\)](#) on climate policy alternatives to carbon pricing. His abstract shares, "In the real-world of political opposition and complex market failures, carbon pricing alone will not achieve deep GHG mitigation targets. ### Rare Earth Elements Research

Economics graduate student Prabuddha Prakash will present his research on the economics of rare earth elements at the [Camp Resources](#) environmental economics workshop on August 8 and 9 in Asheville, North Carolina. Prabuddha's research, partially supported by the [Department of Energy](#), investigates China's ability to manipulate the global market for rare earth

elements used in electric vehicle batteries, solar panels, and defense applications ranging from laser-guided rockets to jets.



### Coal Ash Workshop

The Baker Center hosted a workshop on July 14 with representatives from [TVA](#) and [Southern Company](#) on the economics and policy implications of using coal ash for beneficial uses ranging from construction materials to sources for critical minerals.



### U.S.-Korea NextGen Scholars Program

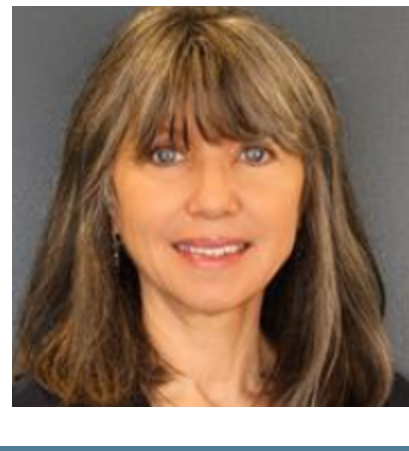

The program was established to help mentor the next

generation of Korean specialists in the United States who will make long-term contributions to the U.S.-ROK relationship.



### Terrestrial Biodiversity

[Energy & Environment](#) Fellow [Dr. Paul Armsworth](#) recently co-authored a [paper](#) titled, "Co-benefits for terrestrial biodiversity and ecosystem services available from contrasting land protection policies in the contiguous United States." The research finds that the scope of the co-benefits can significantly vary according to context and policy decisions.

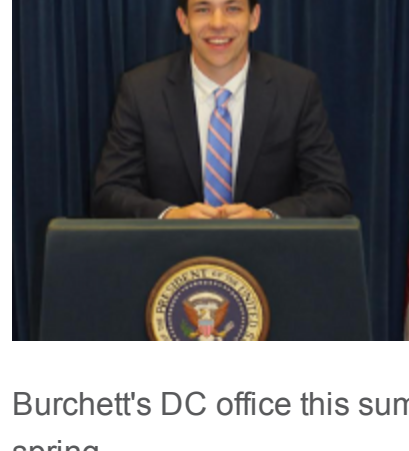

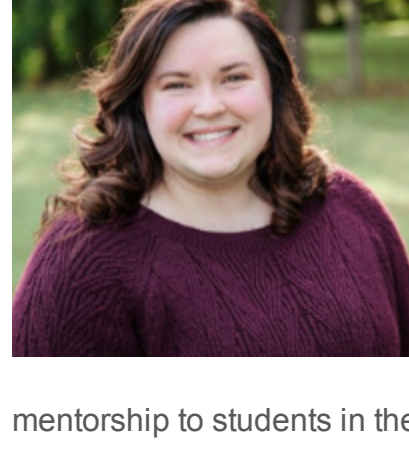
### Student Spotlight

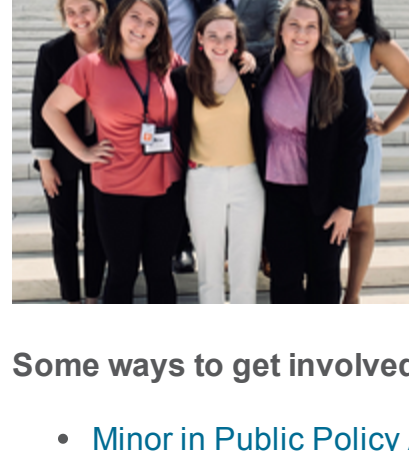


### Baker Center Staff Spotlight

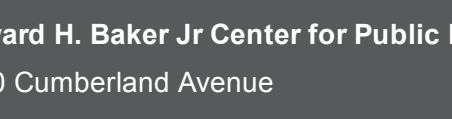
