Global Security Director to Present at Ocean Governance and Geopolitics Seminar

As a part of the <u>GEOSEAS</u> and <u>OCEANGOV</u> projects funded by the Norweigan Research Council, <u>Global Security Program</u> Director, <u>Krista</u> Wiegand, will be presenting at the Ocean Governance and Geopolitics seminar in Oslo, Norway on September 6-7. Wiegand is the only

American scholar invited to this seminar, which includes 42 scholars and researchers from around the world. Wiegand will be presenting on a panel called "Challenges at Sea.".

Dr. Wiegand also spent two weeks this past August in Southeast Asia, engaged in Track II security dialogues with diplomats, military officers, and scholars about U.S. relations with Southeast Asian countries in the context of the U.S. China rivalry and the South China Sea dispute.

Center Directors Bill Lyons, Policy Partnerships, and Katie Cahill, Leadership & Governance, provided more than 45 local municipal leaders in Tennessee with guidance on community engagement for shared decision-making as part of the Municipal Technical Advisory Service's IMPACT Series through the University of

Dr. Matt Buehler, Global Security Senior Fellow, spent two months conducting field research in Morocco for his next book project on the U.S.-Morocco alliance. Dr. Buehler is a specialist of comparative politics and international relations in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. His first book, Why Alliances Fail: Islamist and Leftist Coalitions in North Africa, won the 2019 Southeast

Regional Middle East & Islamic Studies book prize.
