Concentration Courses (9 credit hours)

HBS 591: Internship (3 credit hours)

A 3-credit hour internship (HBS 591) is required for all students who lack significant administrative experience. Students who waive the internship must take an additional elective to obtain the 36 required credits.

HBS 596: Capstone (3 credit hours)

A 3-credit hour capstone course is required. All non-executive MPA candidates are required to take this course, preferably during the last semester in the program. Capstone serves in lieu of a comprehensive exam for the MPA degree.
